

THE LEGENDARY DIVER

Krzysztof was born in 1968. He's a polish deep-sea diver, with two world records on his account. As a child he was already interested in extreme sports. First it was hiking, then cave exploring, and finally he discovered deep sea diving. He connected diving with his second hobby, and started exploring caves underwater.



When he was 5 he started hiking, and few years later he also started skiing. After he turned 18, he made a diver license and started diving. His favorite place to dive are underwater caves, he even discovered the deepest underwater cave in the world - Hranicka Propast in Czechia.



He worked really hard to be able to dive so deep, and thanks to his determination and perfect genes, he could beat two world records. They are the deepest diving with rebreather in the Red Sea (283m) and the deepest cave dive (278m).



Obviously, he got some injuries in his career, fortunately most of them weren't very serious. His worst injury was a broken leg. He broke it during paragliding while he was landing. He couldn't move, but soon everything came back to normal

Krzysztof is 55 years old now, but he's still diving, not as a professional, but as a free time activity, and he's still enjoying it. Krzysztof's sport might be not the most popular one, we can't watch it live on tv, but for sure we have to admit, that divers can do incredible things. Ocean is scary, but they don't mind about that, they just want to swim for their dreams.
